The new Hillview Drive Park features a 30 metre-long playable sculpture set on top of a lush, planted mound.

Director of MDG Landscape Architects Ed Billings said it's for the young and old.

"It's engaging and enticing for adults and kids alike. The structure is covered in an ornate, perforated steel mesh curtain, which allows kids to interact between the inside and outside.

"The internal areas feature three different levels where kids can climb, explore, hang, scramble, and slide in and out of the structure," Ed said.

"Key elements of the structure are also up lit at night. Within the broader park, there are areas for picnicking and passive recreation.

"The park offers an innovative, unique and memorable play experience for the new residents of Peppercorn Hill to enjoy for many years to come."

Peppercorn Hill Project Manager Russell Chaplin emphasised the structure's facade and its proximity to the thoroughfare of Donnybrook.

"It's a unique sight that draws your attention as you drive along Donnybrook Road," he said.

"The structure doesn't appear to be something you can use at first glance – it's a distinct alternative to a standard playground."

"I'm sure any kid that sees it will be excited to try it out."

Free facepainting and craft activities which were provided were also very popular, while the sounds and rhythm of DJ Dagogo added to the happy vibe of the event.

Everyone was especially 'eggstatic' to see the Easter Bunny make a special visit and happily pose for photos with attendees. Adults enjoyed seeing their kids having so much fun, and also appreciated the free hot cross buns and coffees handed out to ticket holders.


Warm but not too hot weather conditions on the day capped off yet another memorable, family-themed event for our growing Peppercorn Hill community.



Route 524 bus connecting Peppercorn Hill to Donnybrook train station

Peppercorn Hill and neighbouring communities welcomed the much-anticipated <u>Route 524 bus service</u>.

This new service takes residents in Peppercorn Hill, Donnybrae and surrounding areas to Donnybrook train station, Hume Anglican Grammar and other stops along the way

Route Overview

Route 524 operates in a clockwise loop, providing daily services to and from Donnybrook Station starting in Hillview Drive, Peppercorn Hill.

Operating Hours

- Weekdays: 5:30am to 9:00pm
- Every 30 minutes during peak times
 (7:00am 9:00am and 3:00pm 8:00pm)
- Every 40 minutes during off-peak times
- Weekends: 6:30am to 7:00pm, services every 40 minutes

- Donnybrook Station
- Hume Anglican Grammar School
- Donnybrook Primary School
- Hillview Drive, Peppercorn Hill


Connections

At Donnybrook Station, passengers can transfer to the <u>Route 501 shuttle</u> for direct access to Craigieburn Station or board V/Line services (train and bus) to reach metro or regional areas.

Colour
